The overriding theme of this year's May Festival is about inspiring young minds to be creative, to challenge them with exciting new activities and masterclasses and, most of all, to enjoy words by celebrating them in both the written and spoken format.

By focusing on our ethos of inspiring children to develop a life-long love of reading, we have prepared a very special May Festival programme, designed to offer lots of fun, hands-on and interactive activities for them to enjoy.

With a whole range of exciting events designed to get right to the very heart of what books are all about, we hope children will relish lots of opportunities not only to listen and learn, but also to create their own literary magic. There are carefully researched workshops which will give your children the chance to create their very own masterpiece. And soft skills such as creative thinking sit side-by-side with expert model-making tuition – all with a touch of humour, originality and, most important of all, FUN.

What does Shrewsbury Bookfest do?



The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service

Shrewsbury Bookfest has always been an independent, not-for-profit organisation, run primarily by a small group of volunteers. In 2007 we obtained charitable status. In 2009 we won the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service – the equivalent of an MBE and the highest award that can be given to a voluntary organisation.

Through a series of regular projects with schools and families, Shrewsbury Bookfest's aim is to bring the world of books alive for children in Shropshire; to inspire, entertain and enthuse them with a life-long love of reading.

Our work has caught the eye of renowned national bodies such as The Guardian newspaper and Hodder Education, who have featured Shrewsbury Bookfest at their conferences and invited us to speak and to share the success and impact of our reading development projects with delegates from the education sector.



Book Award: Our child-led reading development project delivered into Shropshire primary schools. The first Book Award project in 2010 for 9-11-year-olds was an overwhelming success. And, in response to a growing demand from schools, we have run it biennially ever since. Book Award 2018 is now well underway and has been expanded to include a new Picture Book Award project for 5-7-year-olds. Book Award 2018 is being enjoyed by well over 2,000 pupils across Shropshire.



Schools' Week: To coincide with World Book Day in March, Schools' Week is a programme of author visits, workshops and masterclasses for Shropshire primary schools. Plans are underway for Schools' Week 2019 so if you think your school would like to be part of this, do get in touch with us.


With Mat Tobin



On 4th November, one hundred years to the day that Wilfred Owen was killed, Shrewsbury Bookfest in collaboration with St. Chad's Music Festival will present a very special concert at Theatre Severn in celebration of the life and work of Wilfred Owen. In the first half of the concert the Bookfest Remembers Choir, made up of schools and choirs across Shropshire, will perform works by local composer Caz Besterman with texts by Wilfred Owen and the other war poets. The Band & Bugles of the Shropshire Army Cadet Force will also be performing.



In the second half of the concert the **Consortium of Shropshire Choirs** will perform a newly commissioned work – **Move Him into the Sun** – by the renowned choral composer/conductor **Bob Chilcott**. The orchestra will be led by **John Moore** with tenor **Dafydd Wyn Jones**. There will be readings of Owen's letters to his mother.

Child Protection Policy

Unless attending a Masterclass event or Workshop, children under 12 MUST be accompanied by a ticket-paying adult at all Festival events. Children under two who do not require a seat, do not require a ticket. Shrewsbury Bookfest maintains a Child Protection Policy, but we cannot act in loco parentis or take responsibility for unsupervised children.

Masterclasses

For these events, you need only buy a ticket for each young person attending. Adults attend for free, should they wish to stay. If not, we ask parents/carers to drop children off at the venue, sign them in, and leave a mobile contact number in case of emergencies. Please ensure that you are able to collect your young person(s) at the specified event end time.

Age Range

We've included a recommended age range for each event to help you choose. These ages are carefully chosen in consultation with the publisher and author/illustrator/presenter, taking into account the length, content and format of each event. However, the age ranges are a guideline only.











