Practise the words on this list using look, say, cover, write and check. Hint: when a verb has a short vowel sound followed by a single consonant, you must double the final consonant before you add -ed or -ing. The only exception to this is with words that end with 'x'.



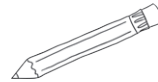
