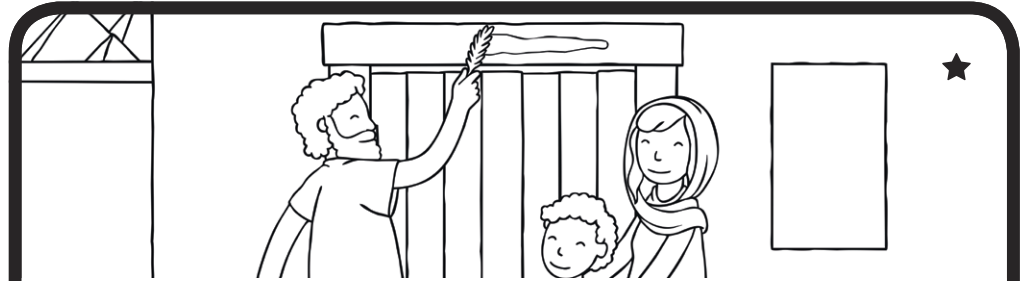


The Story of Moses
